Graded as PCGS Genuine, this piece can best be described as having the details of Extremely Fine with a few scratches and trivial rim nick at 2:30 on each side. The 1944 Steel Cent is also graded PCGS Genuine and has the details of Extremely Fine with some environmental damage. The granular surfaces are consistent with original circ steel cents. 

Front contains portraits of Lincoln, Washington, and Grant—extracted from the \$1, \$5, and \$50. United States of America (from the verso of the \$5) at top. Lincoln Memorial is central vignette with components from \$1.
